This curriculum is designed to provide an AA level Certificate in Anglican Studies. These courses take some of the classes in the Discovering Anglicanism introductory course and expand them into deeper studies. These Anglican Studies courses also include topics not addressed in the Discovering Anglicanism course.

The Certificate in Anglican Studies curriculum is designed to provide the depth and breadth of knowledge about Anglicanism that will be necessary to preserve and pass-on the distinctives of Anglican beliefs, identity, ethos, worship, and other commitments.

This *Certificate in Anglican Studies* Program is

- ✓ an exciting way for Anglicans to structure their ongoing studies of Scripture, worship, and mission.
- ✓ a practical way to complete the education of those who are called to minister within the Anglican context, especially those coming from other backgrounds and those who have attended non-Anglican seminaries.
- ✓ an effective way to structure the year of Study following Ordination to the Diaconate. It is a way to hold Transitional Deacons accountable to complete the Ongoing Studies assigned to them by the Board of Examining Chaplains prior to Ordination to the Priesthood.
- ✓ a convenient way for clergy to structure their ongoing Continuing Education.

To complete the Program and receive a Certificate as a layperson or as an auditing clergyperson, the curriculum includes 12 Courses, each with 10 topics. To complete the Certificate for Credit in an ordination process, additional writing assignments and 4 Practicums are also required.
